Voters in the Green Mountain State will select a governor, attorney general, and state treasurer in November. All 150 seats in the state house and all 30 seats in the state senate will also be on the ballot. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the governor's office while Democrats are expected to retain control of the attorney general's office, state treasurer's office, and the legislature.

Attorney General Charity Clark

Charity Clark has served as Vermont's Attorney since 2023. Her career began in private practice in Vermont and New York before she began working as an Assistant Attorney General in the Public Protection Division under former Attorney General William Sorrell (D) in 2014. She served as Chief of Staff for former Attorney General T.J. Donovan (D) from 2018 to 2022.

As attorney general, Clark has addressed data privacy concerns, effects of social media on kids, access to reproductive rights, domestic violence laws, public safety, environmental protections, suicide prevention, homelessness, and fraud.

Clark's office <u>sued</u> Meta and investigated TikTok for alleged **harm to children** in violation of Vermont's Consumer Protection Act. She also continues to advocate for a comprehensive data **privacy** bill within the state.

She sued the FDA to increase accessibility to medication for **reproductive healthcare** and defended a lawsuit against the state over a new law that requires crisis pregnancy centers to be transparent.

Clark has <u>advocated</u> for expansions and revisions to Vermont's **criminal records** sealing law to shift towards a full sealing model rather than primarily expungement.

Under Clark's direction, the attorney general's office sued Monsanto for alleged contamination of the state's water resources and schools with PCBs. Clark has also joined numerous national efforts to preserve the environment and plans to continue this effort.

Her re-election <u>campaign</u> focuses on continuing the work of her first term.

Trivia: Clark is the first woman elected as Attorney General in Vermont.
