Voters in the Green Mountain State will select a governor, attorney general, and state treasurer in November. All 150 seats in the state house and all 30 seats in the state senate will also be on the ballot. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the governor's office while Democrats are expected to retain control of the attorney general's office, state treasurer's office, and the legislature.

Ture Nelson

Ture Nelson served as an investigator for the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration for 32 years, including as Division Administrator of the Vermont Division, before retiring. He currently serves as an Interim Town Administrator.

Nelson was nominated by the Republican Primary winner, H. Brook Paige, at a Republican State Committee meeting to take his place on the ballot in late August.

At the time of writing, Nelson does not have an active campaign website, but, in a <u>recent</u> <u>interview</u>, he expressed an intent to prioritize service if elected.

Trivia: Nelson assumed his current role shortly after major floods in Vermont in July 2023.
