Voters in Missouri will elect a governor, attorney general, and state treasurer this year. All 163 seats in the House of Representatives, and 17 of 34 seats in the Senate, are also up for reelection. Larry Sabato's Crystal Ball rates the gubernatorial race as Safe Republican, and the Cook Political report rates it as Solid Republican.

Attorney General

Elad Gross

Elad Gross (D) advanced to the general election as the Democratic Party's only candidate for attorney general. Gross earned a law degree from the Washington University School of Law and has worked as an attorney focused on constitutional and civil rights issues and as a CEO. He also served a stint as an Assistant Attorney General.

If elected, Gross <u>plans</u> to address scammer by enforcing the Do Not Call list and developing **AI** regulations. He would confront state government **corruption** by managing a dedicated Public Corruption Unit, pursing misappropriated funds, and enforcing Missouri's Sunshine Law. He also plans to coordinate a statewide effort to reduce **violent crime** and ensure accountability within the justice system.
