Voters in Utah this year will elect a governor, It. governor, attorney general, and treasurer. All 75 Utah House of Representatives seats are up for reelection as well, along with 14 out of 29 senate seats. Republicans are expected to maintain control of the executive offices and retain their supermajorities in both chambers of the legislature. The state has been under Republican trifecta control for over 30 years.

Rudy Bautista (D) defeated David Carlson (D) in the Democratic convention for attorney general to square off against former State Representative Derek Brown (R) in the general election.
